The sun was falling down



Libraries around the world by Penny Boukaki 3rd grade


As Albert Einstein once said: "The only thing that you absolutely have to know is the location of the library." That's why I've decided to present you some famous libraries around the world.

1. The Royal Library of Alexandria is the most famous and the largest library in the ancient world. It was burned three times and a likeness of the library was built in Alexandria in 2002.
2. The Boston Public Library was the first public library in the USA and the first library to lend books to the public. It also has a collection of 6.1 million books!
3. Bodleian Library is the research library of Oxford University. It has the copyright to every book published in the United Kingdom.
4. The British Library was built in 1973 and is one of the world's greatest libraries. It has a great collection of stamps and it hosts events like music and discussions.
5. Celsus Library is world famous for its beauty. It was the tomb of the governor of Ephesus, Gaius Julius Celsus Polemaeanus. It has more than 12,000 scrolls and it is considered the third richest library of ancient times.



6. Folger Shakespeare Library is in Washington and it is famous for its collection of Shakespeare's printed works. It also organizes programs about Shakespeare education, poems, plays and lectures.
7. The Library of Congress is also in Washington and it is the largest library in the world. It has three buildings and it has the most books of any other library in the world. Although anyone can visit it, only members of the government can actually use it.
8. The National Library of Canada is in Ottawa and it has a very important role in the preservation of materials. It also includes

musical works that were created in Canada.



9. National Szechenyi Library is located in Hungary and is the biggest library of the country. It is inside the Royal Palace and it is a reading library. But make sure you purchase a ticket before you enter it.

In a hot frying pan put the oil, the onions, the clove of garlic and the sliced chicken until it gets brown. Then you add some (a little) water and leave it for 30 minutes. After that you add the chopped peppers, the mushrooms, the chopped tomatoes, the corn, the beans, salt, pepper and you leave it for 20 minutes. At the end your food shouldn't be watery.

The beautiful Luisa is a medicinal flower that cares for our good health in many ways, as tea or oil, as both flowers and leaves are especially beneficial for the human body.
