Stonehenge is one of Great Britain's most famous landmarks. It consists of 100 huge stones placed in a circular layout. It is 5000 years old and has been a UNESCO World Heritage Site since 1986. People believe it was built to celebrate the summer solstice.

The summer solstice, around 21st June, is the day of the year with the most daylight. It is also the first day of the summer. When the sun rises on the summer solstice, it lines up with one of the stones in Stonehenge, called the heel stone, and its first rays shine through a stone archway in the centre circle. Today, as in the past, lots of British people celebrate the summer solstice at Stonehenge every year.
